

M.Ed. In Curriculum & Instruction Teacher Leadership- TESOL Specialization

This is a two-year program that leads to a Master's of Education (M.Ed.). This program is designed for (a) certified K-12 teachers in the U.S. who wish to add on ESOL certification for the State of Maryland, (b) those wishing to teach ESOL in U.S. adult, community college, or university settings, or (c) those wishing to teach at all levels in international contexts. The program consists of 30 credit hours of coursework and a separate Graduate Seminar Paper.

All students must apply and be formally admitted into the M.Ed. in TESOL program. Students will be notified of their application status in the spring.

- 2. Graduate Seminar Paper (Due the semester of graduation)
