| 1 pkg yellow cake mix | 1 1/2 C sugar |
| 1 15oz can pumpkin | 1 t cinnamon (I sometimes use pumpkin pie spice instead) |
| 1 12 oz can evaporated milk | 1/2 t salt |
| 3 large eggs | 1 C butter, melted |

Preheat oven to 350. Grease 9 x 13 inch pan with butter (or cooking spray). Combine pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar, cinnamon and salt; pour into pan. Sprinkle cake mix over pumpkin mixture and drizzle melted butter evenly over the top. Bake at 350 for 50-55 minutes.
