Preparing Highly Qualified and Diverse Teachers

- Teacher candidates engage in a rigorous teacher preparation program. Students in our programs take and perform well on the Educative Teaching Performance Assessment (edTPA) which helps lay the foundation for our students to eventually become Nationally Board certified teachers.
- A partnership between the College of Education and the College of Computer, Mathematical and Natural Sciences, Terrapin Teachers is an innovative Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) teacher pathway. The program partners with Montgomery and Prince George's community colleges to recruit a diverse pool of undergraduate students, non-instructional staff

(i.e. teaching aides) and career changes into the STEM teaching field. Students in the program gain early field experience and graduate with a teaching certification in grades 7-12.

- The Creative Initiatives in Teacher Education (CITE) is a graduate-level teacher preparation program that prepares students and working professionals for a master's degree and teacher certification in grades 1-6 with an emphasis on special education or English for Speakers of Other Languages. The program is offered in partnership with Montgomery County Public Schools and the Maryland State Department of Education.
- Funded by the Maryland State Department of Education and led by researchers at the College of Education, the **Professional Development Schools (PDS) 2025**Project provides professional learning for prospective, new, and experienced teachers. Our researchers are playing a critical role in:
 - reimagining the teacher education internship. They have developed a yearlong teacher residency program

- that will serve as a model for all Maryland teacher candidates.
- creating a Mentor Teacher Academy to provide additional support to teachers in their early years of teaching.
- developing a teacher career ladder to ensure a pathway for career advancement in Maryland schools.
 The model provides local districts with clear descriptions of professional responsibilities and advancement requirements at each step on the career ladder.

- The University of Maryland Writing
 Project is a grant funded teacher-made
 and -led professional development for
 current teachers. These professional
 development programs, including classroom coaching opportunities, focus on
 classroom inquiry in literacy and writing,
 classroom writing communities, and
 teacher leadership.
- The Maryland Initiative for Literacy and Equity (MILE), an interdisciplinary initiative aimed at combating persistent illiteracy in Maryland and the surrounding region, offers professional learning opportunities to school system leaders, teachers, librarians and other literacy professionals, on topics such as the science of reading, literacy instruction for multilingual learners and structured literacy instruction.

Innovative and Research-Based Strategies and Tools for Teacher Support

MPowering Teachers (MPT) is a machine learning tool for mathematics instruction measurement and feedback. With MPT, teachers receive more frequent feedback about their teaching by using an

- electronic device to collect audio of their classroom instruction. MPT was developed by Assistant Professor Jing Liu.
- Developed by Professor Jade Wexler, Adaptive Intervention Model Coaching System (AIM Coaching) offers ongoing and individualized job-embedded professional development for middle school teachers implementing literacy practices in content-area classes like social studies, science and English language arts, as well as in supplemental intervention courses, such as special education. AIM Coaching also integrates evidence-based adolescent literacy practices school-wide.
