4. Center Equity

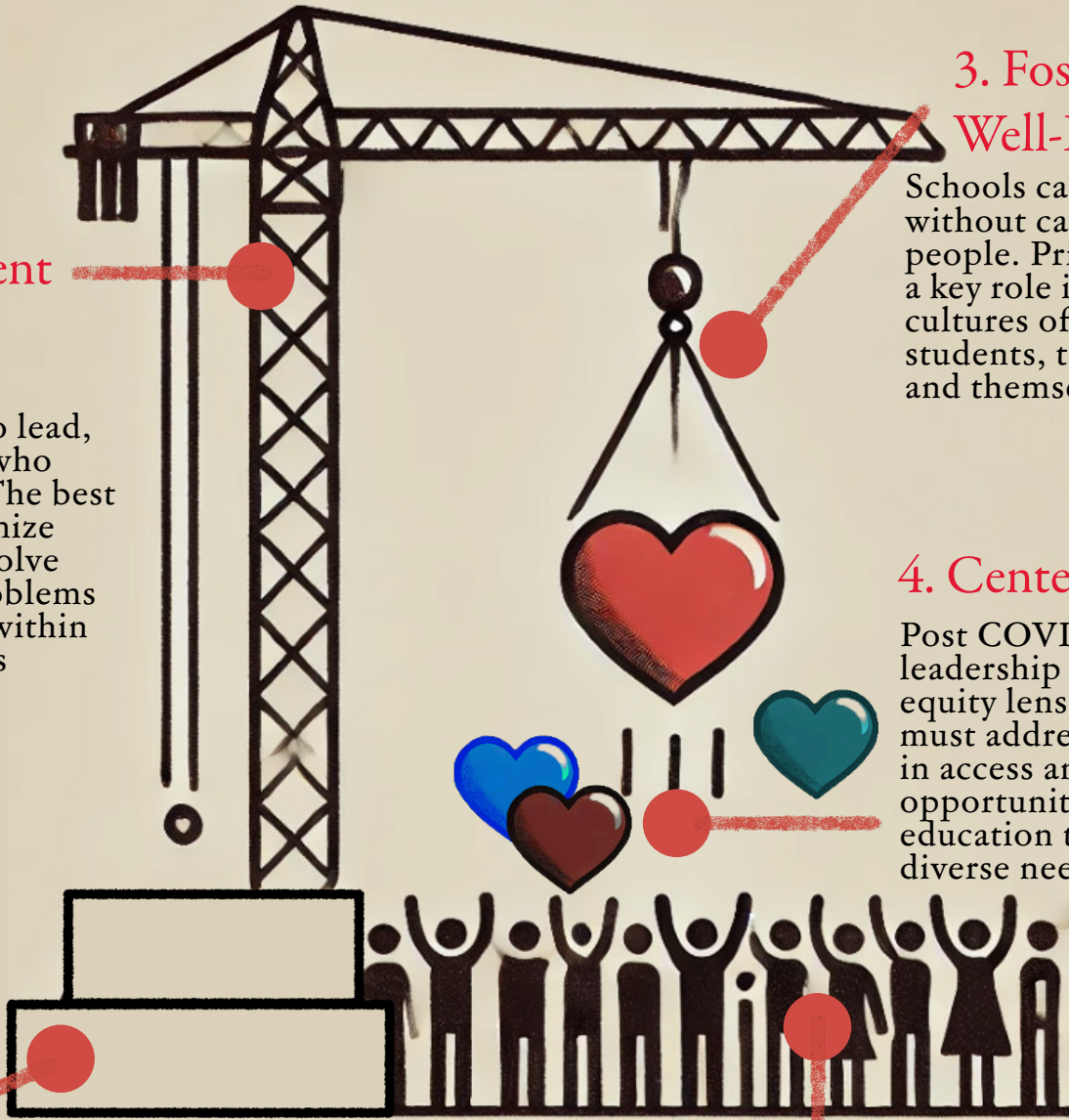
Post COVID-19 leadership demands an equity lens. Principals must address disparities in access and opportunity, tailoring education to meet diverse needs.
