  - a. Note on lack of response to recent death on campus

- i. Although acknowledging the issue of contagion, no one specifically did anything e.g. canceling classes, discussion, etc.
- ii. This really hurt undergraduates and they did not feel the response was adequate.
- iii. No guidance for instructors.
- iv. No moment of silence at football game, not blocking off of where it happened
- v. Connection to Dean's Lecture that teachers and instructors are not prepared or given guidance. There is no playbook, but we need resources and guidance. Perhaps we as a community can acknowledge that we can do better.
- vi. Can tie this to our mental health activities in the Spring.
- vii. Could we repurpose space and time for this specifically, and also long term for mental health?
- viii. Could we partner with the Counseling Center or our own Counseling faculty to provide accurate and helpful information and resources about mental health? - ix. Discussion of what faculty and staff have the authority or ability or leeway to do. What actions do we have support for (canceling/ending class, changing deadlines, etc.)? Communication of this is key. Could we discuss this during the retreat?
- x. Is there some level of mental health training that we could all receive? Anyone who has contact with students should have some basic level of mental health first aid training.
- xi. 988 number for mental health. Add these to the UMD alert system?
- b. Update from Eric on CoE Student Representation & Advocacy work
  - i. Interrelation of graduate student organizations, representation, etc.
  - ii. Avoiding hierarchy, but clear plan
  - iii. Plan to have a joint GSA/GSO retreat soon to discuss further
