LATERAL READING

YOUR GUIDE TO SMART ONLINE RESEARCH

CHECK YOUR FEELINGS

Notice how the reading makes you feel. Angry? Anxious? Pause and investigate the author further.







LEAVE & LEARN

Don't linger on the original source. Open a new tab and search for info about the author or website's credibility.



SCAN SMART

Don't click right away! Scan beyond the first 2 results for trusted sources. Look for major organizations and differing perspectives.



JUDGE THE ORIGINAL SOURCE

Based on your research, ask:
Is this source knowledgeable?
Trustworthy? Unbiased? Use
your findings to interpret
the original info.
